

## 英語（リスニング） スクリプト

## ○音声確認

これから音量を調節します。  
英語の音声を約30秒間流します。その間にあなたが聞きやすい音量に調節してください。  
この英語は、問題そのものではありませんので、内容を把握する必要はありません。  
音声の最後でイヤホンを外すよう指示します。指示があったら、すぐに外し、机の上に置いてください。  
それでは音量の調節を始めます。

M: Let's talk about the newsletter.

W: OK, let's check what we've got so far. We've decided to have one main story and one short story, right?

M: Right. And what about pictures? Should we have one for each story?

W: I'm not so sure about that. Maybe it would be too much. How about just for the main story?

M: That sounds good. Now, what will our stories be? We could do one about the students who visited from Hawaii. Maybe we could use one of the photos they sent us.

○試験問題（英語の音声は2回流れます。）

これからリスニングテストを始めます。

この試験では、聞き取る英語は2回流します。質問文と選択肢は音声ではなく、すべて問題冊子に印刷されています。

問題を解答するごとに解答用紙にマークしてください。問題冊子に記入しておいて、解答時間の途中や最後にまとめて解答用紙にマークしてはいけません。なお、聞き取る英語のあとに、音声の流れていない時間があります。それが解答をマークする時間です。音声の流れがなくても、赤いランプが今のようについていれば故障ではありません。

W: But I'm really hungry.

Question No. 12

W: Press down the button and hold it for five seconds to restart the machine.

M: OK. Nothing's happening.

W: You have to press and hold.

Question No. 13

M: My daughter started university in April.

W: Oh, how's she doing so far?

M: Well, she has good days and bad days.

Questions No. 17 to 19

W: I'm interested in reading trends in the U.S.

M: Here's a table showing the changing number of American readers between 2002 and 2008.

W: Hmm.... Interesting. There was an overall increase of 7%.

M: That's right. The number of readers increased in most age groups. Only readers between the ages of 45 and 54 decreased in number by 3%.

W: I wonder why.

M: It's hard to explain, because readers near that age group increased. Those aged 35 to 44 increased by 9%, as did people in their late 50s to early 60s.

W: I noticed my grandmother started reading for pleasure after she retired.

M: I'm not surprised. The elderly aged 75 and older showed the second largest increase of 15%.

W: What about young people?

M: They tend to read books on the Internet. That explains why people in their late teens and early twenties showed the largest increase—21%.

W: That's helpful information. Thanks.

Question No. 21

When the ship arrived in Seattle, a worker found a cat that had been trapped among the containers for nearly a month. The cat was taken to an animal shelter where her physical condition was checked. People were amazed the cat survived so long. Interestingly, the ship, which had previously had a rat problem, was now free of rats.

Question No. 22

As a professional photographer I would like to give you some suggestions for successful landscape photography. In winter, for example, when the days are short, you need to know where you're going and what you want to photograph. You can get familiar with the area you're planning to visit by reading guidebooks and studying maps. Then, you'll know beforehand where the most attractive locations are, rather than leaving it to chance. At the location, you may need to get off the main path, so you should be careful. To take a good photo, it may be necessary to be in freezing conditions which might be dangerous.

Questions No. 23 to 25

Many of the world's best-loved symphonies are known by popular nicknames given by the general public or music publishers rather than by their composers. A number of Haydn's symphonies have nicknames such as the *Surprise Symphony*, the *Military Symphony* and the *Clock Symphony*. Another example of this type is the *Farewell Symphony*, in which the musicians leave the stage one by one as they finish playing. Eventually, the two violinists who are left put down their instruments and walk away from the stage in silence. This ends the performance.

The story behind this piece is that the prince, for whom Haydn worked, had taken all of the musicians to his second palace in the countryside where he liked to go hunting. The musicians found the weather and working conditions at this place to be very unpleasant. Moreover, they missed their families and the simple comforts of home. When the *Farewell Symphony* was first performed at the country palace, the prince understood the message of Haydn's music at once. The next day he ordered that his entire household return to the city so they could be with their families in time for Christmas.
