Do you know what these graphs are about? Graph 1 shows that more than half of the population in Japan in 2000 was under 50 years old. On the other hand, Graph 2 shows that more than half of the population will be 50 and over 50 in 2030. There will be more elderly people but fewer children in 2030. We call this an aging society with fewer children. Last month I saw a TV program about this kind of society. It said that health care for elderly people costs a lot. Japan can't keep the same health care system in the future. Some families are old couples and elderly people often have to take care of other elderly members in their families. I think these are very serious problems. Do you think we have the same problems around us?

I searched for some examples in my town. First, when I asked my father about his junior high school, I was surprised at the bundle number of homeroom classes. When my father was a student, there were six classes in each grade. Now I go to the same junior high school and there are only three classes. Also, the two elementary schools near here will become one new school next year. These facts show that the number of children in our town is going bundle new school next year.

Second, around my house there are many houses which only elderly people live in. My grandmother has lived alone in the house next to mine since my grandfather died five years ago. The house across from mine is a household of an old couple. I asked my parents what percent of households in our town are households of elderly people. They said that it is about 20%. My mother and her friends sometimes help elderly people to take out their garbage. Last winter we had a lot of snow and it was very hard for elderly people to clear off the snow. Some young people in my town helped to clear off the snow in front of their houses as volunteers. My mother often says there are many small things we can do for elderly people in our daily lives.

Last week I heard some sad news. The traditional festival in my town is not going to take place next year. This is because we cannot hold the festival with fewer young people. When my father was a child, young people in my town played important parts in the festival. They carried heavy *mikoshi* around the town. However, there are only a very few young people who can carry it and people in the older generation are not strong enough. Finally, at the town meeting they have decided that they won't hold the festival next year.

Now, imagine what will happen to our town if this situation continues. There will be more elderly people and fewer children. The problem will be more serious. What do you think about this problem? I think we should find a way to solve it because this is our hometown. We can't stop this aging society easily, but I believe there is something we can do to make our future bright. I'm still not sure what I can do. I need to think about this problem together with someone.
