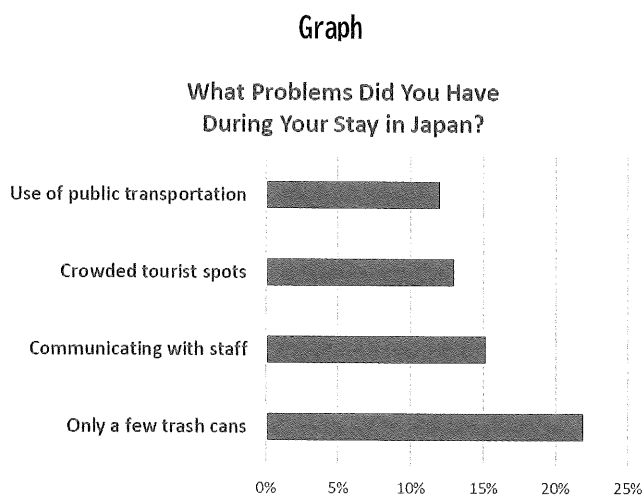

【スミス先生と植田先生の話】

Mr. Smith: I watched the news on TV about tourist spots in Japan last night. It said that some tourist spots in Japan have a problem with trash. Because there are only a few trash cans, a lot of trash can be found around those trash cans. If the city puts more trash cans on the streets, those spots will be cleaner.

Ms. Ueda: I see. You may be right. When I visited Singapore two years ago, there were many big trash cans on the streets. The country was very clean.

Mr. Smith: Many tourists from abroad think that Japan has fewer trash cans on the streets than other countries. I've found data which shows that. In a survey, about 4,200 foreign



tourists were asked about the problems they faced during their stays in Japan. Look at this graph. This is part of the survey results. About 22 percent of the tourists answered, "There were only a few trash cans." The number of foreign tourists who had a problem with the trash cans is larger than the number of foreign tourists who answered, "Communicating with staff was difficult." I understand the results

because I can't find any trash cans when I need one in my city. It's better to have more trash cans outside in Japan.

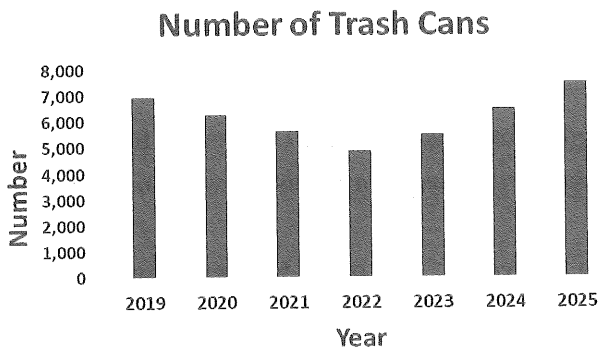

After that, the city considered the people's thoughts and made a plan. Since 2023, the city has been adding more trash cans every year. Seoul tries to solve problems in this way.

Should we put more trash cans on the streets? Does anyone have opinions about that?

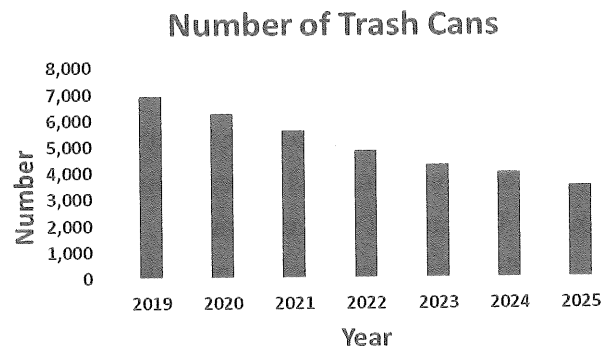

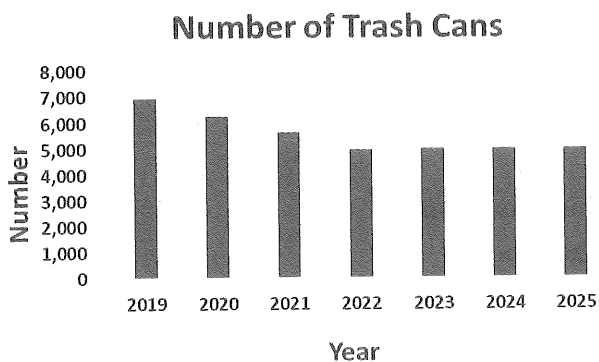

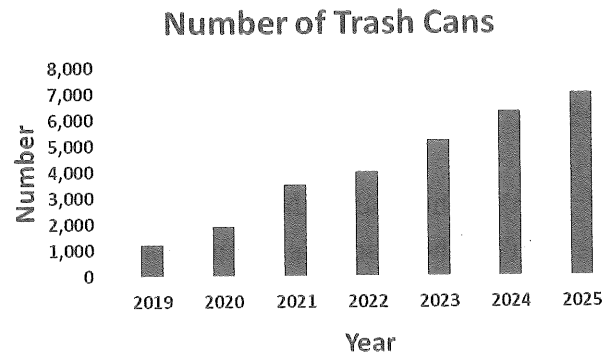

Good point, Haruto. In my opinion, the number of trash cans is not so important. I heard about the case of some cities in Japan. The cities added trash cans because people were littering on the streets. However, they thought that way wasn't very effective for making the cities cleaner.

Ms. Ueda told us that Singapore is a clean country. Actually, in 1968, Singapore made a law saying people mustn't throw away trash on the streets. You have to pay money if you don't follow the rule. I believe that the country is very clean because of ②that rule. If we want to make cities cleaner, we should make such rules.

【ミラー先生の話】

Good morning, everyone. I enjoy watching wild birds on weekends. Have you heard about migratory birds? They're birds which fly long distances to find better conditions. Last week, we studied endangered animals. Migratory birds also face dangerous situations.

Actually, migratory birds are important for the Earth's ecosystems. They connect different ecosystems. For example, when some species travel from one place to another, they spread seeds. However, according to one report, 134 species of migratory birds are in danger of extinction. They face a variety of problems. For example, resting in safe places has been getting more difficult for them because cities and towns are expanding and natural areas are getting smaller. In this way, [①].

Did you know light is one of the problems migratory birds face? Today, artificial lights are necessary in our daily lives. Cities and towns are getting brighter at night. However, these lights can cause various problems for migratory birds traveling at night. One of the things that they use to decide where they should go is the position of stars, but they can't see the stars because of these artificial lights. As a result, they can get confused and lose their way. Moreover, artificial lights cause another serious problem. Migratory birds are attracted to the lights inside buildings. They fly toward these lights, but there are windows they can't see or avoid. Every year a lot of migratory birds are injured because of these barriers.

People around the world have started to try to help migratory birds. A campaign called "World Migratory Bird Day" is held to give people opportunities to think about preserving migratory birds. According to this campaign, international efforts are necessary because migratory birds usually cross borders between countries. Every community around the world can play an important role in supporting migratory birds. So, what can we do to make our cities friendly to migratory birds? I recommend a very easy action which everyone can do even at home. You can just turn off the lights! Actually, various cities in North America have programs to encourage people and companies to turn off the lights that they don't need when a large number of migratory birds fly over these cities. My hometown, Toronto, has the same program, and I joined it. When I first joined it, I felt very happy because I thought my action could be helpful to migratory birds. You may think that this is a very small action. However, if many people work on this program together, we can produce good results. In the event, we walked along the river and looked for fireflies at night. I wanted to use a flashlight to see them, but that was (④). Fireflies can communicate with each other thanks to the light they produce. Artificial lights such as flashlights disturb that. The other example is the rice plant. Longer nights are one of the most important conditions for the rice plant. It usually flowers when nights get longer. The lights on the streets make our city safer. However, if there are lights on the streets around the rice fields, the rice plants there think that the artificial lights are sunshine and may flower later.

We have to remember that things which have a good impact on humans can have a bad impact on other living things. We should take action to live together with other living things.
