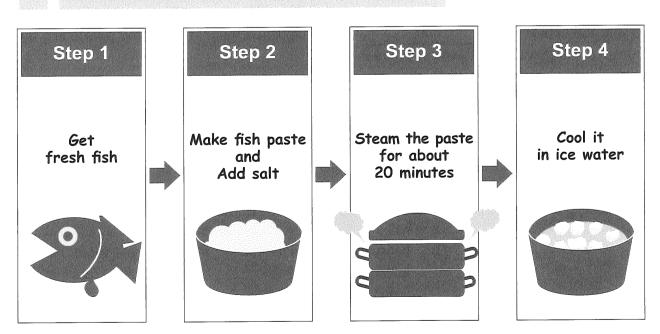

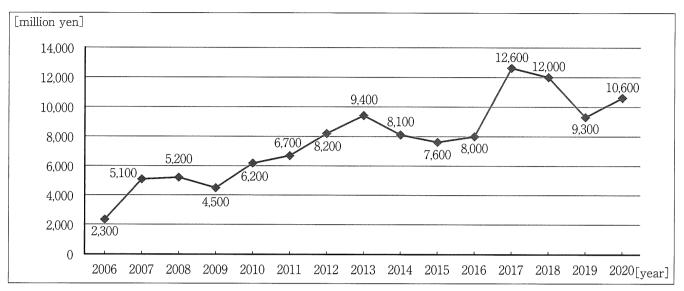

Look at the graph. You can see the export value of bonsai including garden trees from 2006 to 2020. In 2006, the export value was 2,300 million yen. Then, according to the graph, the export value (A). What happened then? I think one reason is a big international bonsai event held in Japan in 2017.

From the graph, we can see Japanese bonsai is becoming more popular in the world. However, now, foreign people doesn't just enjoy (B) bonsai. They also enjoy their new original bonsai. Some people make bonsai by using tropical trees! We can say that they are creating a new bonsai culture from the traditional one. In the future, not only traditional bonsai but also new original bonsai will be loved by more people all over the world.

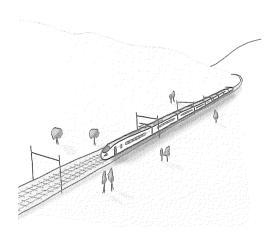

On Saturday, they took a train from London to York. On the train, the boys enjoyed seeing cities, mountains and rivers through the windows. Two hours later, they finally got to York and went into the museum just beside the station. The museum was very large, and they were surprised to know that there were about three hundred trains there. Many of them were very old, and they learned many things about the British railway. Surprisingly, they found a Japanese *Shinkansen*, too. They walked around the museum for almost two hours.



Masaru learned a lot more about the train from David. Masaru spoke to himself, "The Japanese railway was built 150 years ago with the help of British technology, and now Japanese technology is used to develop the British railway." The strong bond between Japan and the U.K. made him happy.

After his homestay in the U.K., he started to study harder. Now he has a dream of becoming an engineer. He wants to work for a project of the British railway in the future. Japan is now designing a new train that can run the fastest in Europe for the U.K.
